



## Projects Furniture

Unsuitably sized furniture can cause excessive slouching or not allow the child's feet to touch the floor. This restricts blood supply to the lower legs and feet and can lead to bad posture. Use over a long period can in turn cause musculoskeletal disorders such as neck and shoulder problems and back ache.

The sizes in the **EN 1729** are based on height. The table shows the size that will fit the majority of children in an age group.

**EN 1729** provides a starting point for selecting furniture but you need to look further when choosing furniture that will stand out from the crowd.

### Furniture should also:

- Promote dynamic postures and allow movement
- Allow flexibility in teaching and learning styles
- Be durable
- Come from companies committed to sustainability
- Be easily and quickly adjustable
- Be easy to maintain and have a suitable warranty
- Be aesthetically pleasing and comfortable to use
- Have additional features if needed
